

Transparency International (TI)'s Malaysia's Corruption Barometer (CB)

improved from 48% in 2010/to 49% in 2011

TI's Corruption Perception Index (CPI)

dropped from 4.4 in 2010 to 4.3 in 2011.



Examples of technical/external assistance:



General

- **Labs** with special expertise: develop the overall corruption programme
- AG's chambers: redrafting new legislations to support GTP on corruption eg. Whistle Blower protection Act
- MACC recruitment of additional staff with forensic capabilities

Regulatory Corruption

- MAMPU/Pemudah: **52% reduction of business licenses** from 761 to 375
- Automated Enforcement System (AES) to reduce traffic police corruption: 64,000 images of traffic offenders

Procurement Corruption

- Tender Boards to include independent members
- Price benchmarking using consultants
- Procurement portal: Govt contract winners are published

Grand Corruption

 Registrar of societies (ROS): New initiative for all political donations channeled to political parties (not individuals) and must be receipted, reported to ROS

from 49% (2011) to **70%** in 2015



from 4.3 (2011) to 5.0 in 2015



from 6.5 to **7** by 2015
