





Extra Preferential Treatments (Compared with AEOG)

The lowest documentation examination and goods inspection rate

Given Priority for goods being inspected

 Customs contact window for handling un-released goods

Non-intrusive inspection

Goods cleared more than NTD 100 million may be via C1 mode







Certification Process of AEOS



AEOS shall submit its self-examination result every year to the competent Customs, and the Customs may conduct spot check at irregular intervals; otherwise, on-site revalidation will be required every 3 years.

Step 1	Side-by-side comparison of AEO criteria
Step 2	AEO joint validation visits
Step 3	The signing of AEO MRA
Step 4	Operationalization of AEO MRA
