Definitions

- Pathway: Any means that allows the entry or spread of a pest
- Entry: Movement of a pest into an area where it is not yet present, or present but not widely distributed and being officially controlled
- Spread: Expansion of the geographical distribution of a pest within an area

Exercise: Fruit Fly Entry and Escape from a Quarantine Area
