## 摘要

本國報告內容是受邀(如附件一)參加 2008 年 6 月 25 日-27 日世界衛生組織基層醫療保健在泰國之協作中心 (WHO Collaborating Center for Primary Health Nursing in Mahidol University, Thailand) 主辦之「2008 Healthy people for a Healthy world」國際會議。本次活動目的配合 WHO 60 週年慶及「Heal for All」30 週年，面對全球化，WHO-Collaborating Center 透過「2008 Healthy people for a Healthy world」論壇，以整體性觀點與跨多元專業領域論述護理專業如何貢獻世界「全民均健」之里程碑。本國報告內容就該協作中心的觀察與會議內容之學習論述。

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### 壹、目的：

本次國是受邀(如附件一)參加 2008 年 6 月 25 日-27 日世界衛生組織基層醫療保健在泰國之協作中心 (WHO Collaborating Center for Primary Health Nursing in Mahidol University, Thailand) 主辦之「2008 Healthy people for a Healthy world」國際會議。本次活動目的配合 WHO 60 週年慶及「Heal for All」30 週年，

面對全球化，WHO-Collaborating center 透過「2008 Healthy people for a Healthy world」論壇，以整體性觀點與跨多元專業領域論述護理專業如何貢獻世界『全民均健』之里程碑。

## 貳、過程

### 一、世界衛生組織基層醫療保健在泰國協作中心

世界衛生組織為支持建立全球化網絡交流平臺，以促進全人類健康，成立各類健康專業人員的協作中心。其相信護理對人類健康貢獻的獨特性與重要性，為支持護理助產發展的促進，以建立全球化護理網路平臺，透過護理社群國際性聯結形成夥伴聯盟，以促進健康與預防疾病。

世界衛生組織協作中心的運作是由 WHO 簽署認定並透過定期評鑑管控，而是否能被簽署為協作中心則視申請單位在研究、培訓、服務的獨特性，及其對全球化健康的重要性作為評估指標。WHO 假設透過 WHO 協作中心的成立與長期建立成功的合作關係，將有助於全世界健康問題的改善。

泰國人口為 6000 多萬人，護理人員數為 18 萬人，成立 2 家世界衛生組織護理助產發展協作中心（WHO C.C. of Nursing and midwifery development center），泰國護理專業發展的特色是一般社區專科護理師（General nurse practitioner）、及進階專科護理師（advanced nurse practitioner）制度。為推展基層保健，泰國政府預估需有 15,000 位一般專科護理師（General nurse practitioner），一般專科護理師需具備 2 年臨床經驗後接受 4 個月訓練，可執行病史詢問、身體檢查、判讀解釋檢驗結果、依建立之指引針對急性常見健康問題開立處方、糖尿病、高血壓、中風穩定病情患者健康管理、及急診處理及轉介，泰國護理助產委員會規劃於 7 年內（至 2013 年）每年培育 1,000 位一般專科護理師，使全國每一個衛生所（涵蓋 1 萬人口）皆有一名一般專科護理師。為促進其國人健康，泰國並於 1987、2007 年出版家庭護理理論與實務相關教科書；其家庭護理引用之護理模式。泰國大學聯考錄取比率僅 10%，而護理學者皆為泰國菁英人才。

## 二、2008『Healthy people for a Healthy world』國際會議簡介

The 2008 International Conference 「Healthy people for a Healthy world」 於 2008 年 6 月 25 日-27 日在泰國曼谷召開，並由泰國皇室公主 Chulabhorn 王詩麗 嘉典禮：

2008「Healthy people for a Healthy world」由泰國 Mahidol University 主辦，美國 University of Michigan, School of Nursing, 加拿大 University of Alberta, Faculty of Nursing, 澳洲 Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology University, Division of Nursing and Midwifery 及日本 Yamaguchi, University, Faculty of Health Science 共同協辦，約有世界各國近 600 位出席會議。

本次活動目的配合 WHO 60 週年慶及「Heal for All」30 週年，面對全球化，WHO-Collaborating center 透過「2008 Healthy people for a Healthy world」論壇，以整體性觀點與跨多元專業領域論述護理專業如何貢獻世界「全民均健」之里程碑。

會議日期是 6/26-6/28 三天，議程包括專題演講、專家座談、口頭發表及海報發表如附件二。會議內容以 WHO 政策倡導與護理專業發展為核心設計，從政策與管理、健康與性別、健康與健康促進、護理人力資源挑戰、災難護理、文化與健康弱勢等面向專題論述。口頭分組發表包括：健康促進、健康政策與照護體系、護理與助產教育、慢性病與心理照護管理、健康照護人力資源管理、文化與健康弱勢、健康照護實証研究、家庭與照顧者、婦女健康、生活品質。

台灣護理界出席本次會議踴躍，包括高雄醫學大學王秀紅教授、高雄醫學大學、美和科技大學黃惠滿助理教授做口頭論文發表及許多醫院、學校，代表有多篇海報發表。

### 參、心得

#### 一、『好的開始』是關鍵

1986 年護理協同合作中心想法開始被發展，領導護理為全民健康努力，第 1

個護理協同中心是芝加哥大學，1987 年 WHO 召開護理協作中心全球網絡發展會議，透過國際會議及區域會議，討論全球護理組織網絡的潛在可能性，及護理對全民健康目標的承諾。透過 20 個國家護理主管在泰國 (Thailand) 舉行研習會，由泰國衛生部主辦，Dr. Amelia Maglacas 主持，在此次會議成立 5 個 WHO 協作中心，包括歐洲的 Finland、Denmark、France、Yugoslavia 及美洲 University of Illinois at Chicago。WHO 簽署的第一期協作中心至今已有 20 年經驗，而開始地點就在泰國 (Thailand)。

## 二、「特色發展」是重點

從這次會議的觀察與學習，發現泰國護理專業發展特色如下

- (一) 泰國政府長期支持護理人才到美國護理名校就讀博士，以儲備培育該國師資種子，發展護理專業的領導人才。
- (二) 因為泰國領導人才與國際護理學校指導教授的深厚關係，建立泰國與國際護理學校的教學、研究與服務的質質與永續發展，如長期的國際護理學生與學者交換計畫。
- (三) 泰國成立泰國王妃獎，供世界各國申請，以強化與各國社會網路連結，建立國際護理知名度。
- (四) 為了增加泰國護理專業能力，2007 年泰國成立國家護理研究中心。
- (五) 該國護理領導人才積極參與政治領域，目前有護理領導人才擔任立法院副院長及立法委員。
- (六) 已立法專科護理師擴展執業範圍在偏遠地區執業
- (七) 該國護理人員貢獻涵蓋了該國偏遠地區 95% 預護需求，而其實證研究支持護理人員在基層照護成本是醫生的 50%。
- (八) 該國護理助產委員會主席是國家醫療保健體系內造委員，積極參與國家健康政策發展與再造。

(九) 該護理助產委員會已完成護理執業範圍及指引確認，包括開處方，並於

2003.10.31 由衛生部之醫學委員會、藥學委員會、牙醫委員會共同簽署認可

(十) 界定社區健康照護者必須至少大學畢業並發展在職教育體系銜接目前在偏

遠地區大多數只有專科學位，但卻有豐富實務照護經驗之社區工作者成為社

區健康專科護理師，並由社區醫院、護理大學與地方衛生局合作，鼓勵偏遠

地而高中華醫學生成為養成公費生，強調社區健康照護能力培養。

### 三、「基層醫療保健」是 **Health for All** 的策略

新世紀醫療照護體系共同面臨貧窮、人口老化、新興傳染病與慢性病，基層  
醫療保健與家庭、公共衛生護理人員功能受重視與期待。

全球健康概念的演進包括從預防疾病到增進健康；從個人預防到環境與群體  
預防，如 1982 年歐洲提出 **health for all**；1986 年歐洲開始發展健康城市；1987  
年美國提出「**health people 2000**」衛生政策。換言之，無論是 歐洲、美國和日本  
都是以群體、以社區為健康測量指標，而 population strategy 和 high risk strategy  
是家庭與社區照護的策略。

## 肆、建議事項

### 一、護理專業的深化與創新

法國大哲學家余果說：觀念是力量，觀念比軍隊還要可怕，因為觀念主導了一切，IDEA = **Imagination + Data - Evaluation - Action**，

因為 IDEA 會讓事情改變。Imagination 是想像，但想像需要資訊與知識評估，整合起來就會變成非常重要的夢想與行動力。IDEA 可從 Imagination 加上知  
識的基礎，再評估然後落實到行動。我們也要問，台灣護理政策的夢想是什麼？

在創新時代下，護理專業應深化核心專長，再透過與多元組織的合作，勇敢  
超越現況界限的思維，在全民健康與健康照護體系的價值鏈上，創造護理專業無  
限的價值。

## 二、基層醫療保健的落實

健康體系再造不是「量」的成長，而是「質」的改善。健康體系再造應該運用人類的創造力與想像力，善用與珍惜目前所擁有的種種資源，以正確的觀念與思維方式切入問題，才得解決問題。台灣有很完整的基層醫療保健架構與歷史，迴歸人類健康需求，我們應該把最基本的基層醫療保健工作做到最好，從健康促進，從健康生活化做起。




