#### To provide an overview of and explain ARCIC's role in the Army, Joint and Allied Joint Doctrine Development Processes.







Defined = The fundamental principles that guide the employment of US military forces in coordinated action toward a common objective. Joint doctrine contained in joint publications also includes terms, tactics, techniques, and procedures. It is authoritative but requires judgment in application.

# **Tactics, Techniques and Procedures**



**tactics.** The employment and ordered arrangement of forces in relation to each other. **techniques.** Non-prescriptive ways or methods used to perform missions, functions, or tasks.

**procedures.** Standard, detailed steps that prescribe how to perform specific tasks.





- Review selected joint related Army doctrine products.




#### <u>CENTER FOR</u> <u>ARMY LESSONS LEARNED (CALL)</u>

- Serves under the direction of Commander, Joint Forces Command
  Conducts actions ranging from joint lessons learned assessments to strategiclevel studies
- Focuses at the JTF through national strategic levels


# **Army Doctrine**



- Authoritative to all US Military Forces






# **Allied Doctrine**






- Guides the employment of Allied and Multinational forces in joint operations

- Promotes standardization among Alliance Nations and Nations working with the Alliance













# **Joint Doctrine Process**






# Joint Doctrine Development Steps and Timeline
