


► Positioning and Role of AFACT

This is intended to be achieved through harmonization and interoperability of trade facilitation and e-Business

 - 1. International Supply Chain Data Harmonization for Asia Pacific
 - 2. UNeDocs AFACT will closely follow the development in this area.
 - 3. Single Window StC suggested that TFT works further on this matter.
 - 4. e-Government Interoperability Framework Thai HoD to work further.

Last StC Resolutions

Resolution 1: The TFT should define the scope of AFACT tasks and conduct consequent budget estimation.

▶ Further work to be done

Resolution 2: The TFT should identify the candidate(s) from STC members or TFT members to conduct stocktaking of members' initiatives.

▶ AFACT Secretariat will be in charge of conducting the work.

Resolution 3: The StC should install a standard procedure for eAsia Award so that it can be implemented in the processing of next eAsia Award in India in 2009.

▶ A TF will be created to develop standard by the end of this year, composed of AFACT Secretariat, India (next host), Thai HoD and TFT Facilitator.

Resolution 4: The TFT should prepare a scheduled plan for JWG transition and instruction for JWG to embark on transition process.

▶ Detailed to be articulated in the Roadmap document

Resolution 5: The TFT should develop RFEOI (Request For Expression Of Interest) documents, both for the existing model and newly proposed model, that specifies the requirements of new AFACT Secretariat.

▶ TFT to prepare according to the agreed schedule.

Resolution 6: The TFT should define the term "coordination of standard" by next StC meeting.

► Agreement reached.

Resolution 7: The TFT should carry on the further work on Single window, while Thai HoD to report for further work on e-Government Interoperability Framework.

▶ To be further developed

Resolution 8: AFACT will further review on the progress of UNeDocs before adopting it as a program of work, while Japan HoD to assess the value and potential of UNeDocs in the AFACT platform.

► AFACT will closely follow the development in this area.




Projected Size of B2B e-Commerce Marke A FOACT

e-Infrastructure / e-Life/ e-Usage

1. e-Infrastructure

Up to June 2007, the number of Chinese Taipei's Internet users exceeded 14 million, making for a penetration rate of more than 60%.

2. e-Life

Some 50% in Chinese Taipei's large enterprises had introduced elearning technologies In 2007. By the end of August 2007, digital TV transmission services were available to 16.41 million people in Chinese Taipei, reaching 71.8% of the island's total population.

3. e-Usage

Mobile phone subscribers-

The number of mobile Internet subscribers has amounted to 23.25 million by the end of 2006.

Households Online-

79% of households in Chinese Taipei have access to the Internet In addition, the Online Households rate was 96% of using proadband internet connections in 2007.



Standards Development

1. e-Health care Services

2007 for completion of two drafts of the situation in Chinese Taipei HL7/XML, health inspection reports message exchange standards on standardized specifications and health inspection reports CDA R2 Guidelines for the implementation.

2. e-Environmental

Development" Water Quality Data Exchange System" (WQDES)

The purpose of this system is to provide a platform for water quality data exchange, integration, and sharing in Chinese Taipei. WQDES adopted XML as a standard for water quality data exchange among different agencies and implemented a number of software toolkits that can assist each agency to transform their data to a XML file, making the data exchange more efficiently.

3. e- Logistics

The Department of Commerce has developed 59 XML standard documents for logistics operations, fully complying with UN/CEFACT ebXML, UMM, CCTS and NDR specifications. Up to 2007, the standard document by 2,616 LSPs.

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The projects developed under working groups of the Taipei EC/EDI Committee

1. The Manufacture Working Group

-"e-Business standards implementation project for machinery industry, 2003~2006" was organized by the Precision Machinery Research & Development Center (PMC).

-Set up 28 machinery industry e-Business standards and 220 suppliers were invited to use peer-to-peer TAMIvas turnkey solutions.

2. The Commerce Working Group

-The "Sectors of Electronic Commercial Promotion Plan" provided consultation to 24 enterprises in distribution services industry and 5,441 enterprises applied B2B e-business solution in 2007.

-Department of Commerce supported 13e-logistics projects, including 5 logistics alliances,4 niche logistics services, and 4 public e-logistics hubs. Totally 877 LSPs and 50 perfect have joined theses e-logistics hubs in 2007.

3. The Environment Working Group

In order to integrate various environmental information into Taiwan Environmental Data Warehouse (TENDW), The TENDW system exchanges data through the usage of Web Services technology, XML file, with 25 different information systems which are mentioned above, to make the exchange process easier and more reliable.

4. The Transportation Working Group

"Maritime Transport Network (MTNet)" -"in 2007

- -"Payment and-elnvoice system" offers users are able to complete payment operation in a single application entry point.
- "E-Delivery-Order System" completes its pilot run in 2007
- -"Port Access Passes system" offers users applying for ports of Keelung, Taichung, Kaohsiung and Hualien long or short-term access passes in 2007.

5. The Customs Working Group

-a Web-based e-payment system has set up to provide diversified, convenient, and 24/7 payment services for duty payers. this channel reached NT 6.3 billion dollars by June 2008.
-In January 2008, was established a mobile clearance service platform, which enables customs officers who work out of the office to access customs internal system and receive crucial messages automatically through the 3G/3.5G communication network by using the mobile devices like PDAs and notebooks.

6. The Finance Working Group

-There are currently 27 financial organizations,more than 8,000 clients subscribing financial services through EDI.
-In 2007, cross-bank transactions through Financial EDI reached 3,012,961 deals in total, the total amount of money was 91,145 million US dollars and the average amount per deal was USD 30,300.

7. The Health Working Group

The "Project of Establishing a Patient-First Environment for Electronic Medical Record Exchange" in 2007 included the following tasks:

- Publicly recruiting 10 medical centers,
- Planning for the amendment and formulation of laws and regulations about electronic medical record exchange between hospitals.
- Holding training courses for technical personnel of electronic medical records.

8. The Construction and Planning Group

The Public Construction Information Project of achievements in 2007 -has stipulated 47 sets of XML-based information exchange standards

- cover mainly 2 categories government procurement and construction management.
- 61 engineering terms were added to the Public Construction Data
 Dictionary accumulating the total number of definitions to 1,060.
 -extend exchange standards for engineering daily received was provided to a total of 118 units

■ Minutes :

1. Election of CWG chair

UN/CEFACT Rapporteur for ASIA Mr.Sang Won LIM informed all present that the Chair of the CWG from Pakistan was not able to attend the 26th AFACT meeting and proposed that Dr.Ju Han KIM from Korea Customs Service to serve as an Acting Chair. All CWG members agreed to the proposal.

2. Opening Remarks

The Chair welcomed all the participants to Seoul and hoped that this meeting will be a productive one and a good opportunity to share ideas, experiences and knowledge for further networking.

3. Introduction of Participants

All the participants gave a brief introduction of themselves and organizations they represent.

4. Adoption of the Agenda

The Chair proposed a draft agenda and participants were asked for their views. The draft agenda of the 20th CWG meeting was amended after several views were offered. The final agenda was accepted and used as the basis to proceed with the meeting.

5. Review and confirmation of the minutes of the last 19th AFACT CWG meeting

The Chair and members reviewed the minutes of the 19th CWG Meeting held in Bangkok Thailand and the working group accepted it without any amendments.

6. Brief report on International customs activities

The Chair informed that Korea Customs is the Vice Chair for the WCO Asia Pacific region between 2008 and 2010, and he introduced main responsibilities of Vice Chair and future activities of WCO Asia Pacific. Brief reports of recent WCO meetings were followed by Korea including WCO UCR Correspondence Meeting and WCO IMSC meeting. Korea Customs' pilot project with the Philippines, the relationship between UCR and RFID technologies and SSTL project between EU and China was also reported. Further to these, the Chair informed that WCO Data Model Ver 3.0 is targeted to be ready by the end of 2009. Additionally, the Chair mentioned that the 2008 WCO IT Conference and Exhibition was co-hosted by Korea Customs in April and it was evaluated as the most successful event.

As a member of APEC Single Window Working Group, Korea Customs presented the materials from the last APEC SCCP meeting held in Cusco Peru.

7. Member Status report

CUPIA, a consulting firm introduced Korea Customs e-Clearance system named as UNI-PASS which won the 2nd e-ASIA Award administered by AFACT as best practice in the 'Trade Facilitation' filed in 2007.

Malaysia's Dagang Net did a presentation on the national single window and highlighted that it follows several UN recommendations. National single window will be owned by the government of Malaysia and operated by Dagang Net.

Indian Customs made a presentation on consolidation of its IT system and e-Commerce on Customs.

Singapore's CrimsonLogic introduced TradeXchange system to the participants and highlighted its ability to interface with various controlling agencies and also connectivity to overseas customs system.

Chinese Taipei talked about the present status of AEO, modern inspection techniques, security on movement of goods and Single window. Single window is the focus of Chinese Taipei Customs for 2008-2014 in the long term.

Joint CWG-IIC meeting

As a customary practice, the Joint CWG-IIC meeting was conducted. IIC Chair introduced Thailand' e-GIF for the participants to take note of an initiative of this nature. The participants acknowledged that similar initiatives must be in place for successful implementation of e-government interoperability.

9. Other Issues

On the matter of the restructuring AFACT organizational framework, the Chair informed members about the potential model discussed in the Steering Committee on October 13. All

members of the CWG agreed that the Customs Working Group be under the Domain Committee, if the new model is accepted.

Conclusion:

The Chair expressed concern about the lack of participation from other customs administrations who are members of AFACT and hoped that future meetings would see better participation from them. The Chair also commented about the continuity of participants in particular the Chair of CWG.

He thanked all members for their active participation and making the session fruitful. The members expressed thanks to the Chair for conducting this meeting to achieve the intended objectives.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 pm with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

■ Minutes :

1. Opening

The Chairman gave opening and welcome remarks at 9:30 am. 10 representatives from Chinese Taipei, Iran, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and Viet Nam participated in this meeting.

2. Confirming Agenda

The meeting started at 9:40 am with self-introduction of the participated members and followed with confirming the agenda.

3. Discussion of Recent Adoption of UN/CEFACT Standards in Asia Region Each member gave a brief introduction of the recent adoption status of UN/CEFACT standards of his (her) country including Chinese Taipei, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and Viet Nam.

Mr. Karlson Hsia gave a presentation on the Core Component development in Chinese Taipei, especially on the planning of National Single Window, meta data of engineering documents in public construction field, and legal regulations with the



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Asia Pacific Council for Trade Facilitation and Electronic Business

standards using CCTS (Core Component Technical Spec.), CCL (Core Component Library) and XML NDR (Naming and Design Rules).

Mr. Fahad Mohammed Al-Jabli introduced the EDI Customs application in Saudi Arabia with standards using UN/EDIFACT and ANSI X12.

Mr. Ashan Weeraman and Mr. T Shantha A De Silva shared the information of EDI Customs application in Sri Lanka with standards using UN/EDIFACT.

4. Election of New Chair and Vice Chair

Mr. Karlson Hsia (Chinese Taipei) and Mr. R. K. Arora (India) were elected as the new Chair and Vice Chair of the term during year 2009 to 2010.

5. Single Window Data Harmonization in Thailand

Ms. Pitchaya Juangpanich gave a presentation on the Single Window Data Harmonization in Thailand with the conclusions that data harmonization among documents or data requirements of all import/export related procedures is a very important exercise to enable data interoperability, thereby realizing the Single Window Paperless Trade Development and with the standards using ebMS and UNeDocs.

6. eCo and EDI Application in Viet Nam

Mr. NGUYEN MANH QUYEN gave a presentation on eCo and EDI Application in Viet Nam with the standards using UN/ISO 9735 (pilot program 2008-2009), ebXML /ISO 15000 (in progress), and UNeDocs (2009-2010).

7. Comparing ebXML messaging (ebMS), AS2 for EDI, EDI VAN, and Web Service Messaging

Comparing the B2B messaging systems between ebMS, AS2 for EDI (i.e. EDI over Internet), EDI VAN, and Web Service messaging mechanism was discussed with the feature comparison matrix, SWOT analysis, and maturity model.

8. Discussion of GUI standards (XForms) for UNeDocs Project

Some issues of the GUI standards (XForms) for UNeDocs Project were discussed, especially on the issues of browser versions (IE6 and IE7), XForms tools, and UNeDocs versions/documents.
