Makers of unsafe goods to be penalised under new scheme

UNDER a new safety scheme to protect the consumer's interest, those who sell inferior products will face a fine, or a jail term, or both.

Called the Consumer Safety Scheme, it will be implemented next month and will re-quire potentially hazardous items such as electrical irons, washing machines and micro-wave ovens to meet certain international safety standards before they can be sold.

Announcing the scheme at the Singapore Institute of Standards and Industrial Research yesterday, Mr Mah Bow Tan, Minister of State (Trade & Industry and Communications), said it would make products meet certain quality and safety standards, and encourage local manufacturers to further upgrade their

products.
The launching ceremony was held at Sisr's seminar on International Standards Organisation and International Trade.

Referring to the scheme as being "in line with our economic objectives". Mr Mah added: "This is yet another step in our objective of making the Made-in-Singapore label recognised world-wide as a sambel." symbol of excellence."

TEST ITEMS

To be implemented in two stages, the 17 items which come under the Consumer Safety Scheme will be phased-in over a period of

■ THE EIGHT items in the first phase are: components of the Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) system, cooking ranges, electric irons, gas cookers, hair dryers, microwave ovens, television and visual display units, and video cassette recorders. These items will have until next June to comply with Sisir's requirements

■ THE OTHER nine items - electric fans, hi-fi equipment, immersion water heaters, kettles, refrigerators, rice cookers, room air-conditioners. vacuum cleaners, and washing machines - will have till June 1993 to meet the scheme's regulations.

any given brand and model of product need to be tested. Once approved, the product

can be freely sold without the

need for further testing.

But if any product sold in the market subsequently fails, it will be taken off the list of approved goods. Also, a maximum fine of up to \$10,000, or two years' jail, or both, would be imposed.

Asked if the cost of testing would be borne by consumers through higher prices, Mr Mah said: "When you amortise the cost of testing over the many units sold, testing costs will be very low. Con-sumers can thus be assured that any impact on prices will be minimal."

At present, only 11 items — mainly electrical fixtures like

plugs and adaptors - are sub-ject to safety standards regu-lated by the Public Utilities

Mr Mah said another reason which prompted the Govern-ment to implement such a scheme was the recent spate of incidents reported in the lo-cal press – like the melting television set and the explod-

ing glass hob.

Speaking at a press conference after the ceremony, Mr
Bob Tan, the deputy president
of the Singapore Manufacturers' Association, said the scheme would not pose as an obstacle to manufacturers here as the SMA had always encouraged them to upgrade so as to keep in touch with the changing standards.

The Safety Authority

- ☐ The Standards, Productivity and Innovation Board (SPRING Singapore) was appointed by MTI in 1991 as the Safety Authority to administer the CPS Scheme
- □ All Controlled Goods must be registered with the Safety Authority before they can be traded, advertised or displayed for sale
- □ Penalty for infringement: \$10,000 fine and/or 2 years imprisonment

Market Surveillance – Public Warning

Decorative lights: Check for safety mark

AS MAJOR festivals like Deepavali and Hari Raya Puasa approach, decorative light retailers will be looking forward to bumper sales.

Buyers beware, though: A spot check of 22 retailers by Spring Singapore in February found that 17 were flouting safety rules.

Two retailers were fined \$2,000 during the February sweep, while the other 15 received warnings.

Under the Consumer Protection (Safety Requirements)

Scheme, 45 different household electrical, electronic and gas appliances must be registered with Spring Singapore and bear the safety mark.

Spring Singapore's quality and standards group director, Mr Teo Nam Kuan, said some of the lightings checked in February were unsafe because the wires were only one-tenth of the approved diameter and could be easily pulled out. Their power rating also exceeded the recommended 100 watts, creating a fire or electrocution risk.

Major malls fined \$9,000

FIXED Price Wholesales and Mohamed Mustafa and Samsuddin have been fined for selling electrical goods without safety marks.

A spot check by the Productivity and Standards Board found some items lacking proper registration. Mustafa was fined \$6,000 for selling a non-registered hi-fi system, and the other store, \$3,000 for a non-registered VCD player.

Anyone with information on such products can call the Safety Authority at 1800-773-3163.

Electric fan shop broke

Last week, Style Home
Accessories was in trouble
again lapped with the maximum \$10,000 fine by the
Subordinate Court, for selling untested table and
standing fans.

Spring Singapore, the
safety authority, requires
sellers of home electrical
appliances to get the products tested for safety and
registered before selling
them, to uvoid the risk of
injury or debth.

Stickers bearing the
safety mark can then be
pasted on the appliances.

The fans which Style
Home Accessories sold did
not bear the safety mark,
which was a breach of consumer protection regulations.



[亚洲新闻网] 新传媒新闻报道,昨天我们报道,新加坡一名男子在为蓝牙耳机充电时,充电器突然爆炸。经过有关公司查证,男子买到的是假货。

左看、右看,被炸开的蓝牙耳机印有著名韩国耳机品牌的名字。不是内行人绝对不会发现它原来是个冒牌货。三星公司甚至表示,从来没有生产过这款WEP310的蓝牙耳机型号。

三星电信及科技产品副总裁黄农翔表示,"我们的蓝牙耳机型号有WEP200,或WEP210,但公司没有产品或器材是WEP310型号的。"

目前消费者能普遍购买到原装或兼容通用的充电器和手机电池,而兼容通用的产品一般要比原装产品便宜两成以上。据了解,受害者法若克是在被告知所买的是原装产品后,才买下蓝牙耳机。公众在购买手机产品之前,应该先查询产品的型号以及注意盒子上的防伪全息贴纸,才能确保不会买到假货。
