

Primary Goals


- Enhance supply chain security by following the rules of WCO SAFE Framework.
- Facilitate the flow of legitimate cargo through the provision of AEO member benefits, while allowing customs to concentrate on higher risk shipment.
- Cooperate with other countries in the international community to secure and facilitate global trade through reaching mutual recognition.

Certification Process of AEOS

Application submitted to customs office

Application documents reviewed by customs office

On-site validation conducted by SCSS

Documents review and validation report sent to AEO Center for final decision

Certificate issued if the application is approved

13

Follow-up for AEOS

- AEOS shall perform self-examination at least once a year; customs may conduct random inspection.
- If customs finds that AEOS fails to conform to security criteria, customs shall issue a notice demanding AEOS to make improvement within 30 days.
- If AEOS fails to make improvement within the deadline, customs may suspend or revoke the status of AEOS.

Comparable Programs

Similarities between Taiwan AEO and Singapore STP:

- **✓** Consistent with WCO SAFE Framework
- ✓ Apply to all supply chain stakeholders
- ▼ The 8 elements of STP security measures correspond to security criteria of Taiwan AEO
- Certificate with 3 years validity period

Trade Relationship

- Singapore is Taiwan's 6th largest trading partner while Taiwan is Singapore's 9th largest trading partner. The annual amount of bilateral trade reached to USD 13.4 billion in 2009.
- Taiwan and Singapore will initiate talks in the near future on the feasibility of signing a bilateral economic cooperation agreement under the framework of the World Trade Organization.
