一、內容摘要

- 3.2009 年非營利組織與自願行動研究協會第38 屆年會」於11 月19 日至11 月21 日在美國俄亥俄州克里夫蘭市舉行。
- 4.Association for Research on Nonprofit Organizations and Voluntary Action (ARNOVA) 為北美最主要的非營利組織或志願行為的研究學會,每年 ARNOVA 所舉辦的年會參與者遍及對非營利組織有興趣的學者,期中包括社會學、公共行政、法律、經濟、政治、財務、會計等領域。本次會議共計有 10 個 session,每一個 session 各有 12 場 Panel。正式發表論文將近 400 篇,與會發表論文者均事先投詳細論文摘要,並經前述學術委員會之篩選後,方得參加。
