摘要

亞太國際教育協會(Asia-Pacific Association for International Education, APAIE)成立於 2004 年，APiae 仿效 NAFSA(美洲教育者協會)與 EAIE(歐洲教育者協會)，每年舉辦教育者年會，為亞太地區教育工作人員提供交流與合作之平台。其創始會員校成員以環太平洋地區各大學為主。自 2006 年第一屆每年由韓國大學、新加坡國立大學、早稻田大學、中國人民大學主辦，2009 年會於中國人民大學舉行，吸引自 42 個國家 380 個機構共 962 人與會。2010 年第五屆由澳洲 Griffith University 主辦。會議地點：澳洲黃金海岸國際會議中心。年會主題：Educating for Extremes: Education for Global Challenges in a Rapidly Changing World。本校藉由參加教育展加以宣傳國際學程計畫並提升本校能見度，進而延攬澳洲學生來校就讀。此外，與全球各校國際事務人員交流、參與國際學者講座，以掌握國際高等教育之脈動。

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一、展場及人員安排

2010 APAIE 於澳洲布里斯本黃金海岸會議中心舉行，今年為其第 5 屆年會，年會結合了多元化的會議主題與展覽，共計有來自超過 40 個國家，800 人參加此次的盛會。今年年會講座共有 12 大子題，因全球氣候異常、傳染疾病(SARS、H1N1)頻傳、環境問題等，本次年會特別著重減碳、醫藥健康、綠能產業對全球高等教育之影響與探討：



本次 APAIE 教育展參展部分比照全球三大教育展做法，由財團法人高等教育國際合作基金會主辦，國立中山大學協辦，國內共計 25 所大專院校共同參與(台灣大專院校參加代表名單附件一)，並以「Study in Taiwan」為展覽主軸，共同行銷推廣台灣的高等教育，希冀透過此教育展平台，將臺灣的優質高等教育宣揚至全球各地，並且與其它學校進行友好交流，建立合作機會。

為期 3 天的展覽，參與的 25 所學校平均分配時段於展覽攤位上介紹台灣的高等教育、協助宣傳本次台灣各校之 Session，並同時推廣所屬學校的課程與國際交流特色，讓參觀者更加印象深刻。更重要的是，2011 年亞太教育者年會暨教育展將在台灣舉行，由國立台灣大學主辦，本校計畫協辦 pre-conference & culture experience，各校代表皆極力宣傳此盛事，邀請全球各校代表參加 2011 APAIE。

台灣本次共承租 6 個攤位(No. 27, 28, 29, 36, 37, 38)，以統一意象與色調呈現台灣高

二、本校參展成果分享

此次參展目的旨乃瞭解亞太高等教育市場、強化姊妹校關係與拓展未來合作夥伴。

此次參展學校中不少是已與本校建立學術合作的姊妹校，藉此機會可和與會代表聯繫加強兩校關係、進一步討論未來合作的具體方案並可索取各校資訊及課程之最新簡介。在姊妹校拜訪部分，我們特地拜訪了韓國梨花女子大學、日本名古屋大學、德國卡爾斯魯厄理工學院、德國杜賓根大學及中國中山大學…等多所姊妹校。與各姊妹校代表表達感謝之意、分享國際化之策略及經驗、索取各校最新簡介及交換學生計畫或暑期課程之資訊，以利回國後提供本校學生參考，鼓勵本校學生踴躍申請各校之短期或暑期課程計畫，步出台灣，與國際學生一同學習，拓展國際視野。

(一) Credit transfer recognition between Taiwanese and Australian universities


- (二) Marketing for student mobility between Taiwanese and Australian universities.

三、檢討與建議

- (一) 校內目前無合適場地接待大型外賓團，僅有行政大樓第一會議室或是第二綜合大樓八樓國際會議廳，建議校方設置一較大型空間，內有投影、擴音等專業會議設備，可放置圓桌或4~6人方桌，如需要亦可在內用餐，以更人性化及友善的方式接待外賓或舉辦研討會，讓外賓或參加人員感受較親切，在此氛圍下可更加促進參加人員對話，增進友誼之關係。
- (二) 亞太教育者年會、美洲教育者年會及歐洲教育者年會為目前全球主要三大年會暨教育展，參展學校及各校參加代表分佈不同區域，建議校方在經費

許可下，建議每年皆派員參加年會並參展，藉由參加年會之各 Session 及教育展，可與全球各校代表建立連結，拓展國際學術合作之機會，並增加本校在國際間之知名度，同時，對參加人員在從事國際事務上可向他校學習相關知識與經驗，相當有助益。

- (三) 2011 APAIE 由國立台灣大學主辦，財團法人高等教育國際合作基金會擬請國內三所大學籌辦北、中、南區 pre-conference & culture experience，本校將舉辦北區場次，邀請各參加代表至本校參加該會前會。
