As an increasing number of commercial activities and businesses locate on and around airports, they are transforming airport areas into new urban growth destinations where air travelers and locals alike work, shop, meet, exchange knowledge, eat, sleep, and are entertained without going more than 15 minutes from the airport. Multimodal transportation infrastructure (air, highway, rail, and links to ports) connect airport city and aerotropolis businesses and people to markets near and far, driving and shaping their growing local, regional and global significance.

The airport city and its greater aerotropolis are changing the way we work, the way we live, and the way metropolitan regions grow. In the process, they are creating tomorrow's world."
