History and structure of the Appellate Body



- Innovation of Uruguay Round negotiations
- Established in 1995
- Governed by Article 17, DSU
- Standing body of 7 Members
- AB Membership to be broadly representative of WTO membership
- DSB-appointed (positive consensus) based on Members' nomination
- > Serve 4-year term, renewable once
- Part time job

- Recognised authority
- ☐ Demonstrated expertise in international law, trade and covered agreements subjects generally
- Unaffiliated with any government
- ☐ No conflict of interest



Initiation of appellate review process deadline for filing appeal

Day 0

Circulation of panel report

Considered for adoption

Considered for adoption

No appeal – panel report adopted

- Panel report not considered for adoption until 20 days, after circulation
- DSB adoption within 60 days of circulation (negative consensus)
- Appeals must be filed no later than 60 days after Panel report is circulated to Members



Who can appeal?



- Appeal only open to the parties to a dispute
- Either party can initiate the appeal appellant
- Party responding referred to as appellee

Third parties cannot initiate appeal

Third participants in appellate review



- > Referred to as **third participants**
- Cannot appeal



Have a right to file written submissions and to participate in the oral hearing

What can be appealed?



- > Appeals limited to:
- issues of law covered in the panel report
- legal interpretations developed by the panel
- No factual findings by the AB
- > Panels' factual findings: In principle, outside the scope of appellate review

Working procedures for appellate review



- > Article 17.9, DSU
- ➤ WP drawn up by AB in consultations with Chairman of DSB and DG
- > WP communicated to Members
- Unlike panel process, standard set of WP
- Latest, WT/AB/WP/6, 16 August 2010
- >Annex 1 sets out timetable for AB process

Appellate review process – notice of appeal





Form?

In writing



To whom?

- Notify AB of decision to appeal (Article 16.4, DSU)
- Notice of appeal to AB Secretariat (Article 20, WP)



Content?

- Title of appealed report
- Name of party filing the notice of appeal
- Service address, telephone, fax
- Brief statement of the nature of appeal



Circulated

To Members as document "WT/DSXXX/1"



Appellate review process – notice of appeal



- > Brief statement of the nature of the appeal:
- Alleged errors in the issues of law and legal interpretation
- ☐ List of the legal provision(s) of the covered agreements with respect to which the panel is alleged to have erred
- ☐ Indicative list of the paragraphs of the panel report containing the alleged errors (without prejudice to refer to the other paragraphs)
- Sufficiency of notice of appeal

Appellate review process – oral hearing



- Time limits for oral statements set by presiding Member
- > AB Division asks parties questions
- ➤ Usually closed to the public, with a few recent exceptions: US/Canada Continued Suspension; EC Airbus; US –Boeing; Australia Apples; US COOL

Appellate review process – Exchange views



- Division of 3 Members handling appeal
- Exchange of views with the other Members (principle of **collegiality**)

Consensus decision-making, possibility of anonymous dissent

Appellate review process – completing the legal analysis



- Basis lack of remand authority
- > Aim secure a positive solution to the dispute
- When may AB complete legal analysis:
- Resolving issues not addressed by the panel
- Applying a different reasoning to the facts
- > Occurs infrequently as it requires:
- Sufficient factual basis drawn from Panel record
- Compliance with due process



Content of AB report



- > Article 17.13, DSU AB may:
- Uphold
- Modify
- Reverse legal findings or conclusions of panel
- Practice, content of AB report:
- Introduction
- Arguments of parties and third participants
- Issues raised on appeal
- Findings
- Conclusion

Content of AB report – Recommendations



- > Article 19, DSU:
- Member to bring measure into conformity with the relevant covered agreement
- AB may suggest ways in which Member could implement the recommendations (not often used)

Panel/AB reports adopted

Statistics on AB process (As of 6 July 2012)




□Appeals notified (excl. 21.5 appeals): 96
