






End-to-End Import Process






End-to-End Export Process

What is a Single Window

"A Single Window is a facility that allows parties involved in trade and transport to lodge standardized information and documents with a single entry point to fulfill all import, export, and transit-related regulatory requirements.

If information is electronic, then individual data elements should only be submitted once".

UNECE Recommendation 33

UNECE Recommendation 33


Recommends Governments to establish Single Window for Cross Border Trade

Defines features:

- ... one time submission
- ..of <u>standardized information and documents</u>
- <u>sharing of information</u> amongst government agencies;
- <u>coordinated controls and inspections</u> of the various governmental authorities;
- Allow <u>payment</u> of duties and other charges;
- Be a <u>source</u> of trade related <u>government</u> information.



Single Window for Trade Facilitation

Integrated Trade Facilitation Strategy – including Single Window

- Trade Facilitation Facilitate: to make trade easy or easier
- Fundamental component of trade and economic development strategy (TF in WTO etc)
- ☐ Single Window is <u>not</u> an end in itself
- SW is not a technology system!



Single Window for Trade Facilitation

- SW is essentially a political / organizational / procedural framework for trade facilitation and export development
- A call to a new way of doing business based on government – government agency and government to business partnership for economic development
- ... that can provides major economic benefits to all parties



Real Focus:

Reducing the economic impact of regulatory processes on cross border trade

Each additional day of delay (e.g. because of trade logistics procedures) reduces trade by at least 1%

Direct and Indirect Cost from import/export-related procedures and required documents is up to 15% of product cost.



Single Window - Under the Hood




SW High-level Architecture




Seamless SW + CMS Architecture for TF






Cargo Clearance Processing – Thailand SW





Cargo Clearance Processing – Taiwan SW



NEED TO FACILITATE TRADE



Regulatory agencies today are increasingly required to provide <u>extensive</u> facilitation while maintaining <u>control</u> over the goods movement.

Facilitating Legitimate Traders


- Less checks



 - Political will
- Single Window implies a "Whole of-Government" / "Connected Government"
 - Integrating Customs and all Govt Agencies involved in trade regulatory requirements
 - G2G / B2G
