Building Integrity Systems in Malaysia:

The TI Malaysia experience

- Facilitation payments: one of the most challenging areas
- Often a lose-lose situation for ethical business
 - A moral stand results in severe problems
 - Failing to make a moral stand compromises the business, may lead to prosecution
- Creativity and persistence required
- Success possible

Instruments to control the practice

- TI Business Principles for Countering Bribery
- Development of policies & procedures
 - Guidelines on gifts and hospitality
 - Corporate vs personal gift
 - "Nominal value": \$15-\$50
 - Facilitation payments policy
 - · Allowed or not?
 - Realism vs legalism/idealism?





Transparency International Malaysia

The role of Integrity Pacts and group action

- Integrity Pact: a bilateral commitment to act with integrity
- Bribes, including facilitation payments, prohibited from both sides
- Whistleblowing channel essential, followed by effective processing of reports and enforcement
- Works best in a monopoly situation (e.g. Government procurement) or as a part of a group action
- Example from Malaysia: construction coalition (WIP)



Key messages

- Not an easy practice to get right
- Support required from Government to make it workable
- Clear guidelines help but needs support of company's top management
- Group action the best approach
