The course combines lectures and practical court exercises to enhance the ability of the forensic interviewer and prosecutor or civil child protection attorney to defend the forensic interview and multidisciplinary team investigation from attacks by the defense. Gundersen NCPTC applies for MN POST Board and MN CLE credits for this course when hosted in Minnesota, and AR CLEST and AR CLE credits for this course when hosted in Arkansas.

Crime Scene to Trial

For: Multidisciplinary teams of four consisting of any combination of the following: prosecutor, social worker, case manager, forensic interviewer, law enforcement officer, investigator or child protection attorney

Using Peer Review to Generate

Corroborating Evidence

For: Multidisciplinary team members and forensic interviewers

In this course, peer review practices will be used to improve the ability of forensic interviewers and multidisciplinary teams (MDTs) to generate corroborating evidence. MDTs will watch several child interviews and discuss what, if anything, the interviewer could have done to elicit additional information from the child that could have translated into corroborating evidence. The attendees will also share their own forensic interviews and participate in a peer review of their own work. No significant experience is required. Gundersen NCPTC applies for AR CLEST and AR CLE credits for this course when hosted in Arkansas.

Applications may be completed individually or as a MDT. Each application must contain a professional who practices forensic interviewing as a member of a multidisciplinary team. You may apply as an MDT (up to four people), but one member must be someone who conducts forensic interviews. Please note that regardless of whether you apply as a group or as an individual, the fee is per person.

First Responder Training: When the Call Comes

This four-hour training course is designed to provide first responders with a better understanding of best practices for initially responding to cases involving child abuse allegations. A primary focus of the training will be how to conduct basic questioning of a child to gain the necessary information for the multidisciplinary team. The training will provide an understanding of how and why the first response can be crucial to the entire multidisciplinary team and a successful child abuse investigation.

The course combines lectures and practical court exercises to enhance the ability of the medical examiner to defend the medical evaluation from attacks by the defense. Chaplains for Children is designed for clergy, chaplains, youth ministers, faith leaders, counselors and other members of a faith community who may work with children or families impacted by child abuse. The course prepares students to recognize and respond to cases of sexual abuse, physical abuse, emotional abuse and neglect. The course discusses in detail the impact of child abuse on a victim's sense of spirituality and offers concrete suggestions for working with medical and mental health professionals to assist a child in coping with maltreatment. The course also discusses ideal child protection policies for a faith-based institution, including handling a situation in which a convicted sex offender seeks to join a congregation. The course includes a review of various child abuse case scenarios and a discussion on appropriate and inappropriate responses.

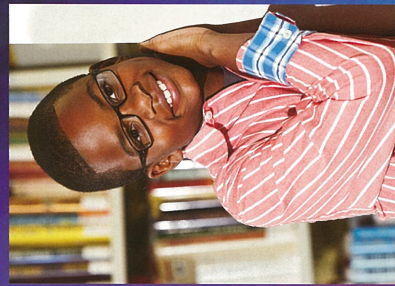
