摘要

「亞太經濟合作會議」(Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation, APEC)成立於 1989 年，為亞太區域最重要的經貿合作論壇，共有 21 個經濟體(Member Economies)。APEC 推動之合作領域從既有的貿易暨投資自由化與便捷化(TILF)、經濟暨技術合作(ECOTECH)領域擴增至影響區域經濟之重要新興議題，例如：就流行疾病預作規劃、打擊恐怖主義、減緩氣候變遷、促進糧食安全，以及落實結構改革等，我國一直積極參與 APEC 各項會議及活動，並透過參與 APEC 會議與活動建立我國專業、活躍的良好形象。

2014 年 APEC 第三次高階官員會議(The Third Senior Officials' Meeting, SOM3)及相關會議於 2014 年 8 月 6 日至 8 月 21 日在中國北京舉行，在衛生福利部邱部長文達的率領下，本署此行參與的會議包括 8 月 11 日「Healthy Women, Healthy Economies」、8 月 12 日至 13 日「2014 Second APEC Health Working Group (HWG) Meeting」、8 月 14 日「APEC LSIF special session meeting」及 8 月 15 日「APEC High-Level Meeting on Health & the Economy (HLM)」等四大會議。

今年的「Healthy Women, Healthy Economies」由美國於 8 月 11 日主辦，目的係透過建立一個更健全的健康體系以增進婦女對經濟活動的參與，會議討論內容包括如何激勵婦女潛能以促進經濟的成長、瞭解與鑑別健康照護的缺陷對婦女在經濟活動上所產生的障礙、以及如何讓健康成為提高婦女勞動力及參與經濟活動的推動者；為期 2 天的「2014 Second APEC HWG Meeting」主要在報告衛生工作組業務及衛生工作組和其他工作組之合作事項、APEC 補助計畫的評選方式與優先對象、推選菲律賓代表為下屆 APEC 衛生工作小組之副主席以及由各經濟體報告過去一年所執行的 APEC 計畫，並展開 Universal Health Coverage (UHC) 政策對話；本署感管組曾組長淑慧於 8 月 14 日「APEC LSIF special session meeting」中報告「APEC Conference on Multi-Drug Resistant Tuberculosis (MDR-TB) prevention, care and control」，並爭取 APEC 經費的補助與支持；8 月 15 日「APEC High-Level Meeting on Health & the Economy (HLM)」主要在討論如何達成「健康亞太 2020」的倡議，我國衛生福利部邱部長文達在會中就我國之健康照護體系發表演說、本署莊副署長人祥及感管組曾組長淑慧分別就「Pandemic preparedness」和「Antimicrobial and Healthcare Associated Infections」議題發表專

題報告。本署代表此行於會議期間與其他經濟會員體就多項衛生議題交換意見，以作為國內衛生相關政策制定與執行的參考。

此行 APEC 會議呼籲各經濟體應持續進行與健康有關之未完成的千禧年任務(Millennium Development Goals, MDGs)，包括預防和控制慢性疾病與新興及再浮現傳染性疾病，降低抗生素抗藥性與 MDR-TB 等、推動「整體性的政府、整體性的社會、整體性的區域」並鼓勵多部門之合作概念、鼓勵公部門及私部門在「Healthy Asia Pacific 2020」之夥伴關係、注重婦女健康與潛能，使健康成為婦女勞動力參與經濟活動的推動者等，我國可藉由 APEC 之平台，與各經濟體建立夥伴關係，加強與 APEC 各經濟體廣泛性之交流，厚植我國在 APEC 相關議題上之領導能力，以強化我國在面對健康相關議題之各種挑戰。

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壹、目的

- 一、 參加「Healthy Women, Healthy Economies」會議，瞭解有關「促進婦女健康進而提升其經濟活動參與能力」相關議題及政策發展趨勢。
- 二、 參加「2014 Second APEC Health Working Group (HWG) Meeting」，瞭解各經濟體提案報告過去一年所執行 APEC 計畫之內容、HWG 提案排序作業要點、HWG-LSIF 聯合會議、選任下一屆(2015-2016 年)HWG 副主席及 2015 年 HWG 活動要點等。
- 三、 於「APEC LSIF special session meeting」就本署提案「APEC Conference on Multi-Drug Resistant Tuberculosis (MDR-TB) prevention, care and control」進行報告，以爭取 APEC 經費的補助與支持。
- 四、 針對「Pandemic preparedness」及「Antimicrobial and Healthcare Associated Infections」議題，於「APEC High-Level Meeting on Health & the Economy (HLM)」會議中發表專題報告。
- 五、 與 APEC 其他經濟會員體就多項衛生議題進行經驗交流，以作為我國制定衛生相關政策之參考。

二、參與會議

2014 年 APEC 第三次高階官員會議及相關會議(the 3rd Senior Officials' Meeting, SOM3 and related meetings)於 8 月 6 日至 21 日在中國北京舉行，其中 8 月 6 日至 19 日為 APEC 各委員會及工作組會議，此項會議的特色為一系列之政策對話，涵蓋貿易與投資(Trade and Investment)、標準與規範(Standards and Conformance)、海關(Customs Procedures)、網際網路(Connectivity)、農業與食物(Agriculture and Food)、林業(Forestry)、電子商務(Electronic Commerce)、反腐敗(Anti-Corruption)、災害管理(Disaster Management)及衛生(Health)等議題。

在衛生福利部邱部長文達的率領下，本署此行參與的會議包括 8 月 11 日「Healthy Women, Healthy Economies」圓桌會議、8 月 12 日至 13 日「2014 APEC Health Working Group (HWG) Meeting」、8 月 14 日「APEC LSIF special session meeting」及 8 月 15 日「APEC High-Level Meeting on Health & the Economy (HLM)」等四大會議，各項會議重點茲分述如下：

(一)「Healthy Women, Healthy Economies」圓桌會議

1.會議重點

本項會議係 APEC 人力資源發展工作組(HRDWG)、衛生工作組(HWG)及婦女與經濟之政策夥伴關係(PPWE)就發展「建立更一個優質的健康體系以增進婦女在經濟上的參與程度」議題於 2014 年 8 月 11 日所召開之圓桌會議，當天會議有 40 個來自勞工、衛生及性別之官員及工商團體與非政府組織之代表，開會討論阻礙婦女參與經濟活動之健康照護上的障礙，會議由 Dr. Nancy Lee(美國衛生及公共服務部之婦女健康副助理部長)主持，會議目的主要在建立一份政策建議和最佳操作方式之「查核清單」，使政府、商業及非政府組織能用於改善女性勞動力於經濟活動之參與。

09:00 – 09:15 (15 minutes): Harnessing the Potential of Women to Drive Economic Growth

The United States, as Project Overseer for the APEC project “Healthy Women, Healthy Economies”, will provide an introduction of the initiative and the desired outcome from today’s discussion, which is to better understand the barriers to health care preventing women’s economic participation.

Dr. Nancy Lee, Deputy Assistant Secretary of Women’s Health and Director of the Office of Women’s Health, Health & Human Services (United States)

Dr. Lee chairs the Coordinating Committee on Women's Health, which advises on activities across the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services that safeguard and improve the physical and mental health of women and girls. In addition, she leads the Office of Women's Health, whose mission is to provide leadership and coordination to improve the health of women and girls through policy, education, and model programs. Dr. Lee worked with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as a medical epidemiologist, focusing on cancer screening and early detection, the epidemiology of reproductive system cancers, the safety of contraceptive methods, and HIV infection.

The Program Director for the PPWE, **Ms. Grace Cruz-Fabella**, will report out on the PPWE meetings in May in Beijing and their efforts to mainstream women’s issues in APEC through

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cross-fora collaboration, including through this project that is endorsed by the PPWE, HWG, and HRDWG. In addition, she will report out on the HRDWG Ministerial Preparatory Meeting in Ha Noi 7 – 8 July and their discussions related to cross-fora collaboration on “Healthy Women, Healthy Economies.”

09:15 – 09:45 (30 minutes): Panel – Health as an Enabler of Women’s Labor Force Participation

Moderated by Dr. Lee, this panel will bring experts from the Asian Development Bank (ADB) to share research on female labor force participation and its relationship to economic growth and stability and experts from the Business for Social Responsibility’s HERproject to share findings on how health-based interventions in the workplace have measurable benefits to business.

1. **Mr. James Nugent**, Director General of Southeast Asia Department, Asian Development Bank

Mr. Nugent will share the March 2014 launch of five joint publications by the ADB, ILO and the Philippine Commission on Women (for the Philippine report) on promoting gender equality in the labor market and related good global legal, economic, and social practices.

2. **Ms. Wang Lin**, Director, Business for Social Responsibility - HERproject

Ms. Wang Lin will share HERproject’s its work on increasing women’s health awareness and access to services in occupational settings, discuss the returns to businesses of these health-based interventions, and provide views on barriers to health care preventing women’s economic participation. She will be joined by Ms. Shirley Xue, who works on the HERproject’s Women in Factories Program in China.

「2014 Second APEC Health Working Group (HWG) Meeting」於8月12日至13日舉行，主要在報告衛生工作組業務及衛生工作組和其他工作組之合作事項、討論APEC補助計畫的評選方式與優先對象、推選菲律賓代表為下屆APEC衛生工作小組之副主席以及各經濟體報告過去一年所執行的APEC計畫，並展開Universal Health Coverage (UHC) 政策對話。

出席會議之經濟體皆認為健康在驅動經濟發展上扮演重要角色，並承諾提升經濟對於增進感染性疾病及控制非傳染性疾病的反應能力。在強化健康體系上，各經濟體同意支持採用安全而有效之傳統醫學於健康照護體系上，同時也包括社區及公私部門之間的合作夥伴關係。會員體們也同意提升健康照護系統之可持久性發展在APEC地區非常重要，並建議各會員體官員在實踐促進健康及預防保健之策略上應包含Universal Health Coverage (UHC) 在內。

本項會議由中國大陸籍的主席Mr. Li Mingzhu 主持開議並致歡迎詞，隨後，與會代表即確認本項會議議程；並由APEC秘書處業務報告；報告者為我外交部派駐APEC的陳盛鵬秘書，他在新加坡之APEC秘書處正巧負責HWG部門，故由他針對APEC重要工作進行報告。關於預算管理委員會(BMC)部分，特別就APEC補助計畫的評選方式與優先對象新的調整作說明；接著為2014進行中或已完成及新的HWG 工作計畫，報告內容如下：

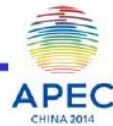


Background

- MDR-TB is a huge threat to the security and stability of global health, especially in the Asia region.
- More than one half of MDR-TB cases occurred in the Asia region

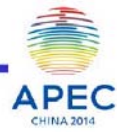

1.會議重點

APEC 在健康及經濟議題上之高階會議最初是由生命科學創新論壇(LSIF)及衛生工作組(HWG)聯合創立的，其宗旨是在強化健康與經濟二大議題在 APEC 的連結，並促使健康與經濟之高級官員更加關注此議題。

傳統上，HLM 會議由 APEC 主辦國之衛生部長主持，並由其所邀請各成員國之衛生部長、政府代表、學術界及商業界領袖共同參與。HLM 的各項提案或建議案，每年均會提交給 APEC 的部長及領袖們。

第一次之高階會議(HLM1)於 2011 年在美國加州的 San Francisco 舉行，會議的焦點在如何致力於克服非傳染性疾病健康上的挑戰及經濟上的負擔，HLM1 並對由生命科學創新論壇(LSIF)及衛生工作組(HWG)就非傳染性疾病於經濟上負擔之議題，所草擬的行動綱領給予強力的支持。

第二次之高階會議(HLM2)於 2012 年在俄羅斯的 Saint Petersburg 舉行，此次的重點在討論婦女與兒童的健康，會議由俄羅斯衛生部副部長主持，智利及中華臺北之衛生部長應邀參與主持會議。

第三次之高階會議(HLM3)於 2012 年 9 月在印尼的 Bali 舉行。在 HLM1 及 HLM2 之成功基礎上，HLM3 檢視亞太地區及 APEC 所提供設立的持續性健康照護系統之重點區域裡，健康對經濟成長及發展的影響程度。HLM3 的成果促成了 2013 年 APEC 部長聯合聲明“亞太地區持續性之健康照護(Sustainable Healthcare in the Asia-Pacific)”的產生，這個承諾與提案，使得 APEC 對關鍵性之健康議題思考如何採取更前瞻性的作為。

第四次之高階會議(the Fourth High Level Meeting, HLM4)在中國大陸北京舉行，討論在 APEC 之 HLM1、HLM2 及 HLM3 成功基礎上，APEC 經濟體如何在 2020 年達成一個更健康的亞太地區，本項會議是 2014 年 APEC 第三次高階官員會議(3rd APEC Senior Officials' & Related Meetings, SMO3)裡的一個重要會議，期望透過圓桌會議的對話，對健康議題上形成共識，並發表 Healthy Asia-Pacific in 2020 之聯合聲明，簡述如下：

HLM4 支持“2020 健康亞太(Healthy Asia Pacific 2020)”成為各經濟體在持續發展經濟上的一項關鍵性促進因素。為賦予健康在經濟活動中更積極的角色，APEC 各經濟體應採取“健康是任何政策的一部分(health in all policies)”的宏觀角度，包括“整體性的政府(whole of government)”、“整體性的社會(whole of society)”及“整體性的區域(whole of region)”，發展更長遠更具執行力的衛生體系，以達成 2020 亞太人民的健康與幸福。

HLM4 同意“Healthy Asia Pacific 2020”工作框架之重點：完成千禧年未完成的任務(Millennium Development Goals, MDGs)；預防和控制慢性疾病；強化健康照護體系以支援全民保健制度；改善緊急狀況之應變、監視及恢復系統；增強亞太地區健康研究與創新。

在這次會議中，我國衛生福利部邱部長文達就我國之健康照護體系發表演說、本署莊副署長人祥及感管組曾組長淑慧分別就「Pandemic preparedness」和「Antimicrobial and Healthcare Associated Infections」議題發表專題報告。

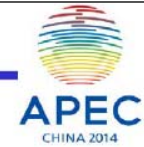

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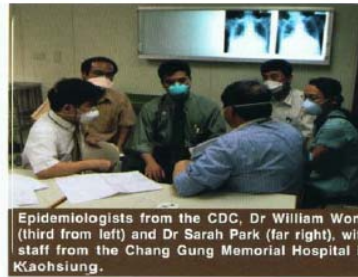

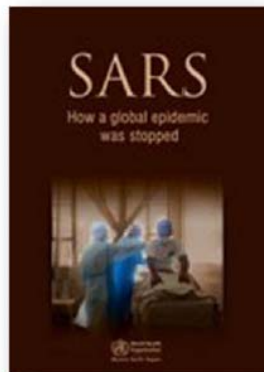

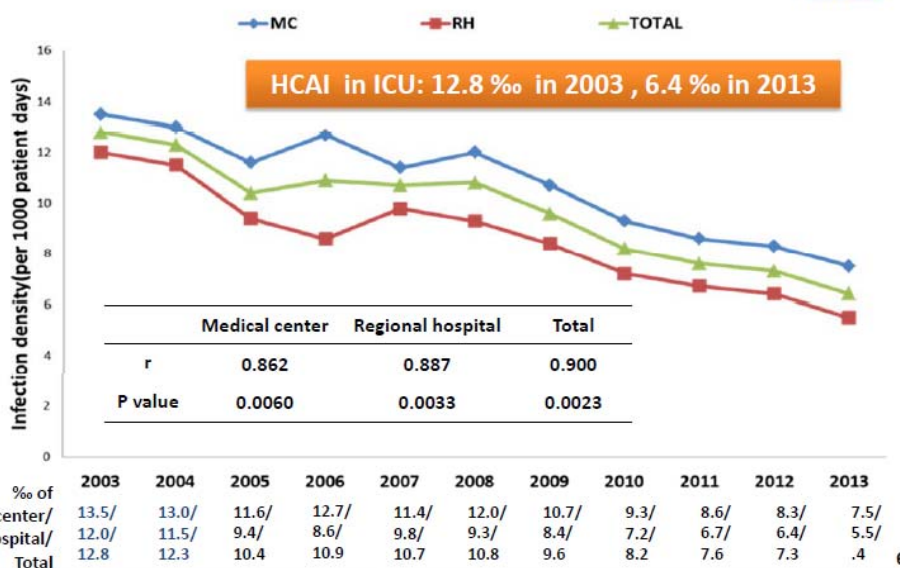

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HCAI density in ICUs, 2003-2013 (TNIS)

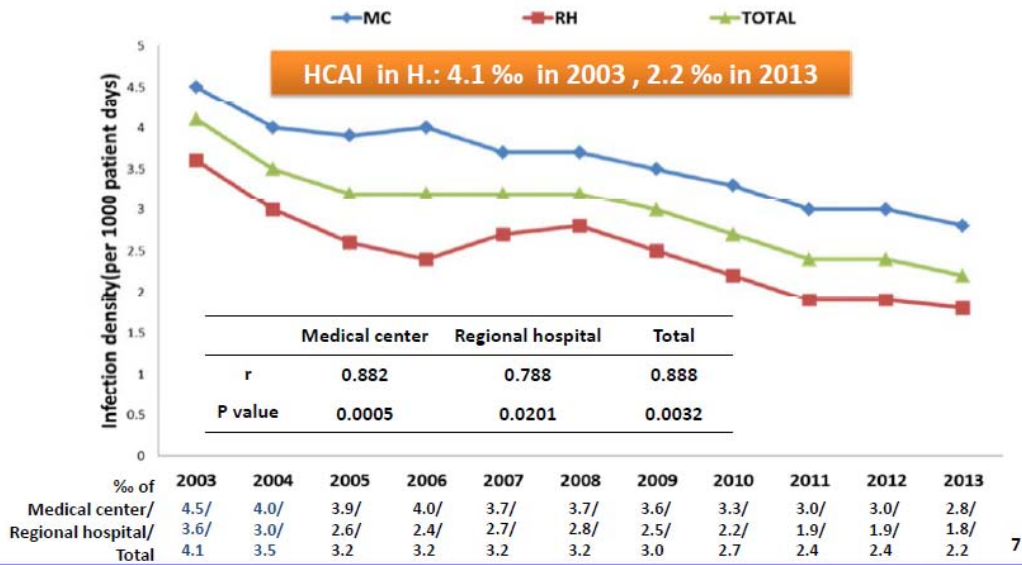

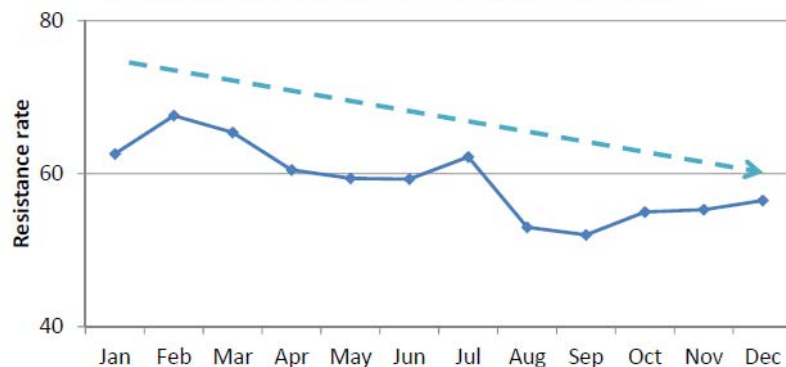

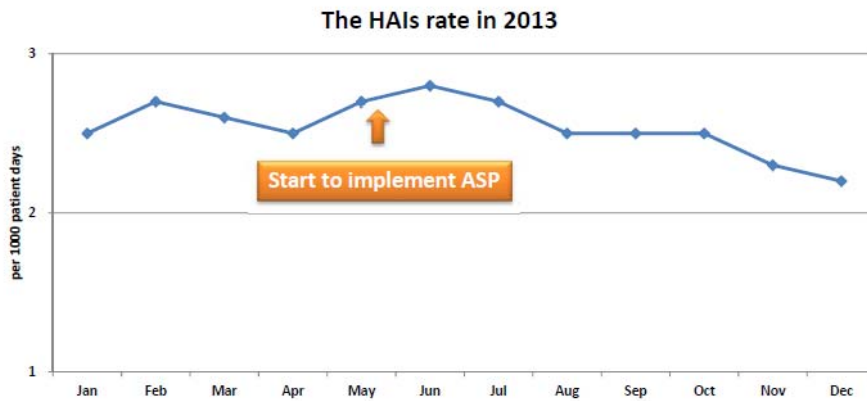

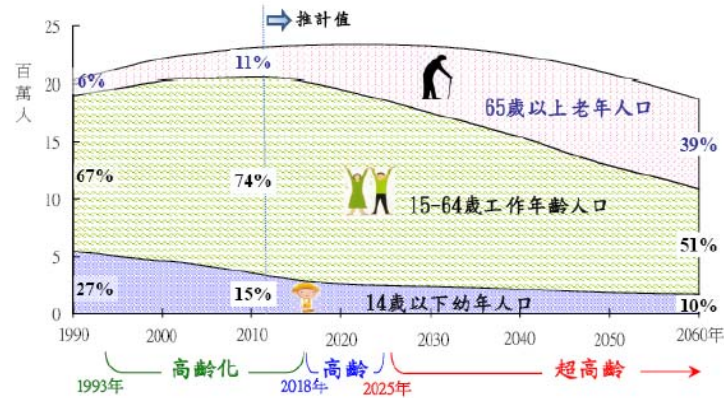

在衛生福利部邱部長文達的率領下，本署此行赴中國北京參加 APEC 第三次高階官員會議及相關會議，除了在 High-Level Meeting on Health & the Economy (HLM)會議上就本署業務相關之「Pandemic preparedness」及「Antimicrobial and Healthcare Associated Infections」議題進行專題報告外，並就「Multi-Drug Resistant Tuberculosis (MDR-TB) prevention, care and control」於 LSIF Special Session Meeting 進行提案報告，爭取 APEC 的支持及經費補助，另外也參與了「Health Working Group」會議相關事務及「婦女健康」相關政策之討論，並在會議期間與各國代表就衛生議題進行意見交換，汲取他國防疫經驗，獲益良多。相關建議如下：

- 二、我國目前雖非 WHO 之會員國，但透過 APEC 相關會議之平台，可增進我國國際能見度，並促進我國與亞太地區其他國家之間的國際衛生合作與經驗交流及建立良好的夥伴關係，厚植我國在 APEC 相關議題上之領導能力，以強化我國在面對健康相關議題之各種挑戰，將對最新衛生政策發展趨勢及未來防疫業務之推動有所助益。
