INDONESIA'S RECENT REGULATORY AND POLICY DEVELOPMENTS

2. INDONESIA'S POLICY AND REGULATORY UPDATE

A. The New Prepaid Registration System

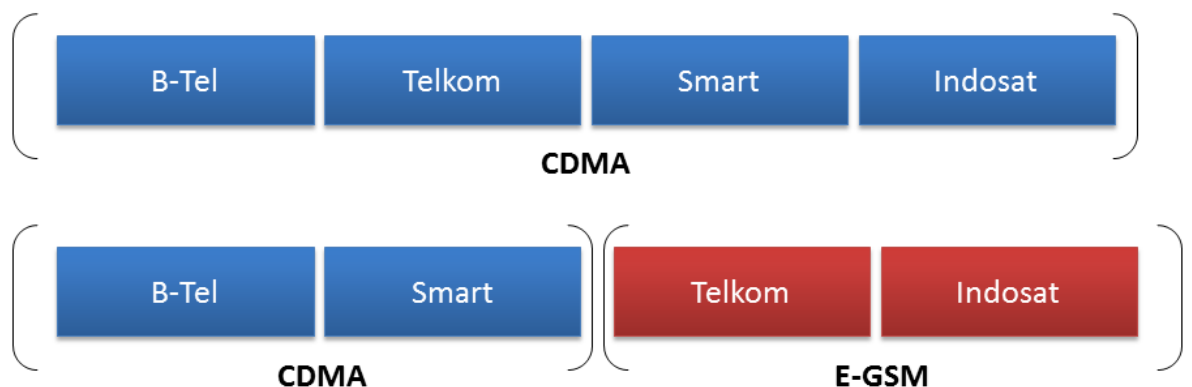
- All prepaid SIM card users in Indonesia will need to re-register their personal information with cellular operators starting August 2014, otherwise they will not be given access to telecommunication services.
- Cellular operators aim to be proactive in enforcing this requirement, which is part of the government's efforts to prevent the use of unregistered prepaid cards for criminal activities.
- New prepaid SIM card users can use their national identity cards, passports, driver's licenses or student cards for registration. The implementation of the regulation will be reviewed and would start imposing it on existing prepaid SIM card users by the end of the year.
- Indonesian Telecommunications Regulatory Authority (BRTI) explained that existing users would be given a six-month period from September this year to register their profiles at operators' outlets.

B. The Relocation of Smart Telecom from 1900 Mhz to 2300 MHz

- Ministry of Communication and Informatics has officially relocated Smart Telecom which operated at 1900 MHz to 2300 MHz. This took place after the issuance of Minister of Communication and Informatics Regulation No. 22/2014 regarding the Use of 2.3 GHz Radio Frequency for the Purpose of Cellular Mobile Telecommunication and Reallocation of 1.9 GHz User to 2.3 GHz, on July 21, 2014.
- In the new regulation, the use of Radio Frequency Band 1.9 GHz on the range of 1903, 125-1910 MHz – paired with 1983,1250 - 1990 MHz which applies Personal Communication System 1900 on 1.9 GHz. Further, 2.3 GHz
- Radio Frequency Band user on radio frequency range of 2330 – 2360 MHz relocated on 1.9 GHz radio frequency is provided with radio frequency range of 2330-2360 MHz relocated on 1.9 GHz.
