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壹、目的

本次行程包括赴瑞典參與「國際政府資訊科技理事會(ICA)計畫委員會議」以及赴斯 洛伐克參與「資訊科技與公共行政研討會(ITAPA 2015)」並拜訪政府機關。

原行政院研考會(現改制為國家發展委員會)代表我國加入「國際政府資訊科技理事會(ICA)」,於2008年第42屆年會加入計畫委員會,2010年成為正式會員,並於2011年由我國主辦第45屆年會,本次赴瑞典係參與ICA計畫委員會2015年第2次會議,主要確認2015年第49屆年會會議議程、檢視目前籌備進程與場地規劃情形,以及後續各屆年會地點及籌備情形的討論。

另,斯洛伐克亦透過外交部駐斯洛伐克代表處,邀請我國於同時間參與「資訊科技與公共行政研討會(ITAPA 2015)」。有鑒於我國於 2012 年 2 月與斯洛伐克簽訂臺斯電子化政府協定,因此本次除參與 ITAPA 會議外,亦同時拜會斯國「總理府資訊社會行動計畫辦公室(Managing Authority of the Operational Programme Information of Society, OPIS)」及「教育暨科技部(Ministry of education, science, research and sport of the slovak republic, MOESRS)」,討論後續合作項目。

貳、執行內容

一、赴瑞典參與「國際政府資訊科技理事會(ICA)計畫委員會議」

「國際政府資訊科技理事會(International Council for Information Technology in Government Administration, ICA)」係由各國中央政府機關所成立,為參與電子 化政府等資訊科技應用有關之國際專業組織。本會代表我國加入該組織,為履行會員國義務,加強與各會員國之交流溝通,每年均派員出席該組織計畫委員會議及年度大會。本次計畫委員會議議程重點包括檢視 2015 年年度大會議程以及講者、實地勘查會議期間各個場地之適切性、討論理事會整體財務及活動現況、檢討各研習小組進度、以及未來領導計畫進度。詳細議程如后:

本次計畫委員會計有以色列(主席)、英國(財務長)、比利時(計畫委員會主席)、日本(副主席)、加拿大(前任主席)、瑞典、希臘、及我國(副主席)等計9人與會,除確認9月召開年會時各項場地及議程外,亦就各項議題之妥適性和主講人等進行確認,以符合本屆年會主題。

在會務討論部分,ICA財務問題仍是主要焦點,有鑑於過去3屆均以較小規模辦理,預期今年若有7成會員繳交年費,在財務上應能維持平衡,故決議不調整明年年費。除了財務議題之外,有鑒於英國籍財務長Larry Caffrey 先生年事已高,並於2014年即提出退休,本次會議中經過討論決議由荷蘭籍國家代表擔任,並由Larry Caffery 先生以1年時間協助業務移轉。至於ICA主席部分,原定去年即由我國擔任,考量2014年國發會剛完成組織改造成立,業務艱鉅,故於會議上協調延至今年確認,本次會議中該項議題再次被提出,我國代表於會前簽准同意維持副主席,故在會議上表達並取得各出席代表諒解後,建議由日本籍副主席先行接任主席,並由荷蘭籍國家代表遞補擔任副主席,至我國仍維持擔任副主席。

在未來領導計畫(Future Leaders Programme)案,經與會討論後,包括烏克蘭、烏拉圭、莫三比克、立陶宛、新加坡、澳洲等6人入選第1階段,後經電子郵件及電話會議討論,於6月初確認由立陶宛和莫三比克獲選參與未來領導計畫,烏拉圭則以觀察員身份參與會議。另外於會議中也確認本屆年會將邀請法國、馬拉威、莫三比克、立陶宛等4國以觀察員身份派員參與本次年會。

在年會議題部分,本(2015)年度第 49 屆年會由瑞典主辦,計畫委員會確認大會主題為「解放行動化政務 - 著重社會挑戰(Unleashing mobile government - addressing societal challenges)」,我國建議主軸議題增列巨量資料分析之主題,經討論後確認增列,我國並推派企業調薪之巨量資料分析為報告主題,邀請財政部財政資訊中心派員與會報告。本次會議紀錄詳如附錄 1、年度大會議程詳如附錄 2。

二、赴斯洛伐克參與 ITAPA 2015 會議並拜訪政府機關

(一) 參與資訊科技與公共行政研討會(ITAPA 2015):

我國自 2008 年起,即受邀出席「資訊科技與公共行政協會(Information Technologies And Public Administration, 簡稱 ITAPA)」年會,ITAPA 年會係為斯洛 伐克最大規模之資通訊國際活動,亦為斯國政府與其資訊產業、歐盟會員國及其他國家 直接溝通交流之平臺,我國經由歷年之參與,於 2012 年 2 月促成「臺斯電子化政府協定」 之簽署。

臺斯電子化政府協定簽署至今,已舉辦 2 屆臺斯電子化政府研討會,斯國並於 2013 年邀請我國前往協助其電子化政府規劃事宜。為保持雙方良好關係及善盡臺斯電子化政 府協定,斯國續邀請我國參加 2015 年 ITAPA 年會,由於本次大會重點在於討論未來斯國 政府資通訊發展方向,並且檢討目前各項由歐盟經費支應計畫之執行進度,因此並未邀 請我國發表演說,而是出席共同瞭解並討論斯國政府資通訊發展。本次 ITAPA 會議報告 重點內容包括:

- 1. 鬆綁法規以強化線上交易,並且注意消費者資料的保護。
- 2.依據歐盟數位程序 2020(Digital Agenda 2020),仍應持續努力建立單一數位市場環境。
- 3.各部門電子化政府進度報告,包括採購系統、數位學習、社福系統以及資料中心..等, 但各項作業由於基礎網路完程度過低,因此尚未看出成效。
- 4. 至本年底前,歐盟所挹注之經費仍有大約300億歐元必須執行完畢。

1. 拜訪總理府資訊社會行動辦公室(OPIS):

時間:5月22日上午10:00~12:00

會談內容:

本次代表團在我國駐斯洛伐克代表處經濟組的安排下,於 ITAPA 會議期間 拜訪斯國總理府資訊社會行動辦公室(OPIS),由主任 Mr. Peter Kostolny 接待, 雙方針對 OPIS 後續運作以及日後臺斯電子化政府合作方式討論約 2 小時,雙方 均認同電子化政府國際交流仍應持續,惟合作方法可因應 OPIS 角色轉換而有所 調整。

OPIS 原主要負責歐盟對斯國挹注經費之執行,但由於目前斯國寬頻網路普及率係全歐盟最低,寬頻網路覆蓋率僅85.3%;且4G行動寬頻使用率僅達人口比率24%,遠低於歐盟平均值59%,進而導致電子化政府之使用率偏低僅達33%。因此,為強化基礎建設,OPIS負責電子化政府之預算將持續至2015年底止,自明(2016)年起新興電子化政府計畫將移至交通部,且明年OPIS部分人員將隨同移轉至交通部。由於該辦公室將於本(2015)年12月完成階段性任務,因此本次OPIS與我方洽談初步決定本會可於年底與其共同辦理成果會議,並且後續可選擇是否改與財政及交通部繼續合作。

有關合作項目,依據其基礎建設計畫(Operational Programme Integrated Infrastructure 2014-2020)中「資訊社會」項目,歐盟將優先支持基礎網路擴展;發展 ICT 產品服務、線上交易;強化 e 化政府服務申辦、e 化學習、e 化關懷、e 化文化、e 化健康。前述項目均為我國電子化服務之強項,後續可持續與斯方治談合作或整廠輸出。

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2.拜訪教育暨科技部(MOESRS):

會談內容:

本次代表團先行聯絡教育暨科技部(MOESRS),並獲同意於ITAPA會議期間拜訪,由處長Mr.Nobert Molnar接待。教育暨科技部主責斯洛伐克教育、科學、研究以及體育事項,該處長Mr.Nobert Molnar係OPIS前主任,因此對電子化發展以及資安議題非常熟悉。Mr.Nobert上任後,即與國家網路局(NASES)合作資訊安全之研究與發展,並且希望藉此增進其國內學生之能力,因此該處長提出希望與我國能有資安專家互訪,並且針對高中以及科技大學學生能有交換學生計畫。此外,該處長希望9月可以訪台討論前述事宜,目前已轉請教育部科技教育司了解後續合作可能性。

參、心得、建議與後續工作事項

一、心得

(一) 持續關注各國電子化政府發展,帶領我國產業參與

透過 ICA 各會員國經驗以及參訪斯洛伐克,各國電子化政府發展均以創新的方式在持續進行,並且以更開放的態度與其他國家合作。雖然各國均有其採購招標委外規定,外國企業較難直接進入各國市場,但我國仍可盡量展現資通訊強項,並且結合當地資訊整合廠商或當地主要企業,合作承攬標案,以開拓我國資通訊廠商於其他國家之商機。

(二) 結合產官學量能,充分發揮電子化政府國際交流效益

利用我國電子化政府各項實務作法及成果,結合官方、產業界及學術界各專業領域,協助友邦或週邊國家電子化政府發展,鞏固政府國際關係,期能建立實質經 質往來,進而促進長期外交關係的建立,發揮發揮電子化政府國際交流最大效益。 (三)以 ICA 年會以及 ITAPA 年會活動作為媒合企業之平台

ICA 年會以及 ITAPA 年會均為大規模的資訊科技活動,ICA 大會每年均有近 20 餘國政府機關同仁參加,而 ITAPA 年會歷年亦有上百家公司或非營利團體機構參加。日後類似會議可規劃我國廠商擔任與談人及演講者參與相關議題,並以我國最佳實作典範為主題,由各廠商說明其推動電子化政府之具體成功案例,藉由展示活動加深產品廣宣效益。

二、建議

- (一)強化我國電子化政府發展,持續努力保持領先優勢,以實力提升我國能見度並取得 各國交流與合作意願。
- (二)建立與友邦良好交流互動關係,善盡與其他國家電子化政府備忘錄與協定之職責,並透過國際大型研討會議,加強與各方之交流合作。
- (三)持續學習其他先進國家電子化政府發展經驗與推動方向,並與國內各級政府機關以 及資服業者分享知識,共同推升前瞻務實之資訊國力。

三、後續工作事項

- (一) 協調相關部會,共同參與 ICA 2015 年度大會,與各國交換經驗並且建立友好關係。
- (二) 尋求經費支持以及資服業者意願,於 ITAPA 2015 年年底第 2 次大會中,主辦一場 次展示會議,帶領我國法人或企業分享電子化政府服務具體成果,尋求與斯商合作
