



# INFORMATION NOTE TRADE FACILITATION AGREEMENT FACILITY (TFAF) REPORT OF ACTIVITIES OCTOBER 12, 2015

#### 1 INTRODUCTION

1.1. This note will explain the activities undertaken by the WTO Trade Facilitation Facility ("the Facility" or "TFAF") since the last Information Note (dated June 5, 2015) that was distributed at the June meeting of the Trade Facilitation Prepcom.

#### 2 THE FACILITY WEBSITE - WWW.TFAFACILITY.ORG

- 2.1. As evidenced by the statistics in the chart below, use of the TFAF website is steadily growing. Initially most of the users were located in developed countries, however, use in developing countries increased rapidly. For example, use of the website in Cambodia expanded from one hit in May to 44 in June.
- 2.2. The Facility website was promoted in the Prepcom meeting, at outreach activities, through a brochure, and a booth in the atrium during both the Global Review and the Public Forum. We also appreciate our Members' efforts to increase awareness of the site.

# 3 SUPPORT/ASSISTANCE

# 3.1 One on One Meetings

a. On July 21, 2015 letters were sent to Ambassadors of developing and LDC countries inviting them to meet with the staff of the Facility. The purpose of these meetings is to, inter alia, help identify the support each Member needs in order to reap the full benefits of the Trade Facilitation Agreement. Meetings began after the summer break and will continue until MC10 (of course we will be happy to meet with Members at any time after).

- b. During these meetings the WTO staff have, in addition, answered questions to explain how Members can benefit from the Facility. Discussions have taken place on whether the Member's national committee is fully functioning and able to prepare the category ABC notifications or if support is needed; whether the government is having success in finding the necessary implementation support from donors, or knows how to access information on donor projects when it is ready. Finally, exchanges have also identified some Member's short-term and long-term needs.
- c. To date meetings have been held with 11 Members. We feel the meetings have generated very positive results. For example, we have been able to help a new delegate have a better understanding of the TFA and, in particular, the special and differential treatment provisions and notification requirements, and helped him to identify the next steps to determine the support needed by his country. One Member had a list of several TFA articles for which her country needs technical assistance. As a result of this meeting the Facility made arrangements for the World Bank to deliver the assistance requested.
- d. We will continue to call missions to offer to set up meetings. If you want to meet immediately please contact the Facility staff. In order to have a successful meeting it is extremely important that the mission is in contact with the national committee before the meeting takes place.

## **4 NATIONAL AND REGIONAL TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE**

4.1. Since the last Information Note, the Facility supported two regional conferences for Parliamentarians and three national workshops and needs assessments. Please note that many other trade facilitation activities were conducted by the WTO under funding from the Global Trust Fund (GTF) that are not listed here.

# **7 PROMOTING COHERENCE**

# 7.1 Donors and Annex D+ organizations

- In order to encourage coherence among assistance providers, the Secretariat continued to conduct meetings with the Annex D + organizations both as a group and on a bilateral basis.
- b. The Facility has coordinated with several of the Annex D organizations in conducting events, such as the joint WTO/World Bank group sessions and teaching a course in the WCO Knowledge Academy, as listed in the chart above. In addition, the Facility

- distributed information at the Public Forum on support programs provided by several Annex D organizations and a donor Member.
- c. The Facility has connected donors that are working in the same region which has led to increased co-operation and joint projects. It has provided information to donors beginning new projects, or expanding existing projects, on the assistance that has already been provided (e.g. a needs assessment) and advised on further assistance that might be needed.
- d. More importantly, Annex D organizations and several donor Members have responded quickly and positively when the Facility has requested implementation support on behalf of a Member.

#### **8 FACILITY ACTIVITIES AT MC10**

- 8.1. The Facility will conduct a session on trade facilitation at MC10. Information about this event will be distributed in due course. The Facility will have a table at the ICTSD event that will be held in the Hilton Hotel where we will distribute information and answer questions.
- 8.2. WTO staff will also available to hold bi-lateral or small group meetings with delegations to answer TFA-related questions or explain how the Facility can provide support for implementation. We would also be happy to arrange meetings with donors and Annex D organizations that will have representatives in Nairobi during the Ministerial. If possible, we would appreciate a request for a meeting in Nairobi in advance, but we are also available for last minute requests.

#### 9 FINANCIAL SITUATION

- 9.1. WTO officials have worked with donor Members to draft Operational Guidelines for the Trade Facilitation Agreement Facility Trust Fund. These Guidelines are the basis for which donors provide funding and set out the annual reporting requirements on how the funding was used. The Guidelines will be made available on the website.
- 9.2. Since the last Information Note was distributed the Facility trust fund received 104,000 CHF from Austria. The UK, through the Department for International Development (DFID) has pledged 370,000 CHF and Norway has pledged 2,500,000 CHF. The trust fund currently contains approximately 800,000 CHF.
