赴韓國浦項出席 APEC-PPSTI "APEC Centers "合作研商會議報告

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壹、 會議說明

本次第一屆 APEC PPSTI(創新科技夥伴)轄下之 8 個中心合作研討會係於本(105)年 6 月 9 日至 11 日在韓國浦項召開,與會成員除包括 APCTP (Asia Pacific Center for Theoretical Physics), APEC CTF (APEC Center for Technology Foresight), ACES (APEC Cooperation for Earthquake Simulation), APECTT (APEC Center for Technology Transfer), APCC (APEC Climate Center), AMGS (APEC Mentoring Center for the Gifted in Science), ACABT (APEC Research Center for Advanced Biohydrogen Technology) and ACTS (APEC Research Center for Typhoon and Society) 等 8 個中心外,還有韓國環境工業科技研究院 (Korea Environmental Industry & Technology Institute, KEITI)、美國國務院,中國大陸科技部,俄羅斯代表,墨西哥代表及馬來西亞代表等及我國科技部選派代表參加,我國的先進生質輕能技術研究中心(ACABT)代表為達甲大學吳石乙院長,颱風及社會研究中心(ACTS)代表為執行秘書廖宇慶教授與張龍耀副研究員,本人則為我國科技部官方代表。APEC PPSTI Secretariat 亦派 Alex Rogers / Program Director 參加會議討論。

貳、會議內容說明

本次會議係由韓國發起,會議召開之初始目的係為研議建立一個對PPSTI轄下 8個 APEC 中心的運作及績效檢視機制,為避免韓方藉由建立相關機制之方式進而主導各 APEC 中心之運作,並進而影響我國現有兩個中心之業務推動,科技部於收到會議通知後即邀集我國現有先進生質輕能技術研究中心(ACABT)及颱風及社會研究中心(ACTS)等兩個中心研商對策,經多次研商後確立我方的立場為:「中華台北贊成設立新的機制來檢視各 APEC 中心的執行績效,以確保各中心的運作符合 APEC 的相關宗旨,但不建議另外成立一個單位來執行這項任務,如此可能會造成組織虛設及資源浪費,建議可以由有意願之各中心,每年輪流彙整所有中心當年度的執行績效,並製作年度報告提交 PPSTI 秘書處。」

經由各個中心的回饋意見以及建議還有各國科技代表之反對意見,因此主辦之韓國 APCTP 在開會以前就改變會議議程將討論成立聯合中心的議程改

為如何評估中心的績效及若有新的中心要成立時的提案程序及評估的過程。 本次會議經過全體與會代表之討論,目前的草案版本如附件一將來要在 PPSTI 大會上提出做最後的決定。草案內容詳如附件一。

參、 會議議程

本次會議共有三天,第一天下午與會人員報到後,主辦單位安排至 Pohang Accelerator Laboratory 進行科技參訪。Pohang Accelerator Laboratory 之同步加速器的規模不如台灣在新竹新建完成的加速器中心。但韓國打算未來再建造一個新一代的同步加速輻射中心。第二天上午主要由各 APEC 中心就研究主題及目前運作進行簡要說明,下午則對於各中心未來運作及績效檢視機制進行討論。第三天上午則針對未來各中心的合作進行意見交流。詳細議程及與會人員名單詳如附件二及附件三。此次會議亦確定 PPSTI 下目前共有 8 個中心並共同起草"浦項宣言"。此動作亦再一次鞏固與確認我國 2 個中心之正式地位亦排除了其它有爭議及未共識之中心。


肆、結論與建議

本次參與會議除針對韓國所提出之「中心成立及評估要點」表示意見外,並參與討論各中心提出「跨中心協同計畫」,最主要是成功阻止韓國所提出在各個 APEC PPSTI 中心之上再成立由韓國主導之總中心之提案,避免韓國藉由此項機制來矮化現有 8 個中心之地位(其中 2 個中心由我國所主導)。

Annex 1: Guidelines

Guidelines on the establishment, management and review of endorsed APEC Centers of the Policy Partnership on Science, Technology and Innovation (PPSTI Centers)

1. Application

1.1. These guidelines apply to (i) all currently endorsed APEC Centers established un der PPSTI and its predecessor ISTWG (hereafter referred to as 'PPSTI Centers') and (ii) all future endorsed PPSTI Centers.

2. Objectives and Roles of PPSTI Centers

- 2.1. PPSTI Centers are established to pursue PPSTI's mission and wider APEC goals.
- 2.2. PPSTI Centers are specialized bodies which bring further valued resources and e xpertise to PPSTI and extend the reach and impact of PPSTI's work.
- 2.3. PPSTI Centers actively engage in and support the advancement of and cooperatio n in science, technology and innovation which contributes to regional growth and development.
- 2.4. PPSTI Centers are encouraged to develop a cooperative alliance to share their information, promote collaborative activities and joint projects.

3. Establishment and endorsement of a PPSTI Center

- 3.1. The Endorsement procedure will comprise:
 - 3.1.1. The proposing economy/economies will endeavour to submit a written prop osal to PPSTI for its consideration at least 6 months in advance of a PPSTI meeting. The proposal template is contained in Attachment 1 to these Guide lines. This applies even if the Center is initially endorsed by Ministers or Economic Leaders.
 - 3.1.2. Based on the proposal, PPSTI will decide by consensus whether to designa te a new PPSTI Center.
 - 3.1.3. The designation can be granted to an existing entity or to an entity in the process of being established.
 - 3.1.4. The final step is signature of the arrangement between the PPSTI Chair (on behalf of PPSTI) and the PPSTI Center must be concluded. Attachment 2 to these Guidelines contains a generic draft sample arrangement.

4. Management of a PPSTI Center

4.1. PPSTI Centers' APEC Projects will be managed in accordance with these Guideli

nes and all existing relevant APEC Guidelines including:

- 4.1.1. APEC Guidelines for Managing Cooperation with Non-Members
 - *Note: PPSTI Centers, once established, will not themselves require NMP to attend any PPSTI event. They may attend either as the PPS TI Center or as a member of their economy's delegation.
- 4.1.2. APEC Publications Guidelines (which includes APEC's Nomenclature Guide lines)
- 4.1.3. APEC Logo Guidelines
- 4.1.4. Guidelines for Hosting APEC Meetings
- 4.1.5. APEC Sponsorship Policy and Guidelines
- 4.1.6. APEC Social Media Guidelines
- 4.1.7. Guidebook on APEC Projects
- 4.2. PPSTI Centers can be sponsored and supported by one economy or by a broad coalition of economies. PPSTI Centers will secure their own human and financial resources, and with the support of APEC as appropriate, prepare adequate envir onments that support their longer term involvement.
- 4.3. The activities of PPSTI Centers will primarily be regional (APEC) in scope.
- 4.4. PPSTI Centers will distinguish when they are representing APEC and when they are acting in another capacity.

5. Reporting and Partnerships

- 5.1. PPSTI Centers will ensure that PPSTI is aware of their proposed activities and, 1 ater, informed about their outcomes. Centers or their representatives will endeavo ur to make presentations to PPSTI annually regarding their:
 - 5.1.1. Forward work plan/overview, progress of current activities and outcomes fr om completed activities.
 - 5.1.2. Exploring partnership activities and projects among PPSTI Centers and othe r APEC economies
- 5.2. PPSTI Centers Cooperation Conferences can be held annually as an institutional approach to collaborative partnerships. These events could be back to back with other PPSTI events.

6. Review of PPSTI Centers

- 6.1. All APEC-funded and self-funded projects by PPSTI Centers will be reviewed an d endorsed according to the guidebook on APEC projects.
- 6.2. PPSTI Centers will be reviewed by PPSTI as requested by members.
- 6.3. PPSTI Centers may be disestablished either (i) voluntarily by the economy or ec onomies that established the Center, or (ii) by PPSTI. If the Center has been en

dorsed by Ministers or Leaders, any PPSTI move to disestablish a Center would need to be considered and endorsed by SOM.

7. Review of these Guidelines

PPSTI may review and update these Guidelines as required by consensus.

Pohang Declaration

Pohang, Republic of Korea June 11, 2016

We, the representatives of the APCTP (Asia Pacific Center for Theoretical Physics), APEC CTF (APEC Center for Technology Foresight), ACES (APEC Cooperation for Earthquake Simulation), APECTT (APEC Center for Technology Transfer), APCC (APEC Climate Center), AMGS (APEC Mentoring Center for the Gifted in Science), ACABT (APEC Research Center for Advanced Biohydrogen Technology), ACTS (APEC Research Center for Typhoon and Society), participating in the APEC-PPSTI "APEC Centers" Cooperation Conference, held in Pohang from 9 to 11 of June 2016, having considered the APEC and PPSTI's mission, and aiming to promote better life, sustainable economic growth, creation of jobs and tackling of common challenges including inter alia climate change and environmental issues for the region through science, technology and innovation, declare as follows:
