Authorized Economic Operator (AEO)

AEO programs aim at balancing supply chain security with trade facilitation.

Mutual Recognition Agreements (MRAs)

MRAs are designed to enable customs officials to identify high-risk shipments more effectively, permit quicker release of goods for AEOs, and increase the economy's reputation and competitive advantage.

Business Sector Opinions


As security measures are on the rise, so too are trade facilitation costs. Although AEOs are classified as low-risk actors, business sectors feel there are not enough benefits, either for AEOs themselves or in signing their MRAs.

Nine Recommendations:

- Conduct private sector satisfaction and inclusion surveys
- 2. Consider stakeholder outreach study tours and workshops
- 3. Consider adopting a flexible approach to compliance and security standards designed to reasonably achieve desirable outcomes
- Encourage SCCP to work on generic capacity-building initiatives (or revitalize work on AEOs in the Collective Action Plan)
- 5. Compile MRA processes in the APEC region and design an APEC AEO MRA checklist
- Consider development of an APEC-wide automated electronic data exchange system and compatible trader identification number systems
- 7. Encourage APEC-wide commitment to OGA engagement
- 8. Conduct an impact evaluation quantifying the trade benefits of MRAs
- Enhance predictability in the AEO approval process

MRAS

- A region-wide checklist along with WCO instruments would be useful to streamline and facilitate negotiations of MRAs.
- Compile MRA processes in the APEC region and design an APEC AEO MRA checklist
- ✓ Interoperability of different AEO identification systems lowers the cost to customs authorities.
- Consider development of an APEC-wide automated electronic data exchange system and compatible trader identification number systems
- ✓ Lack of hard evidence showing benefits of MRAs.
- Conduct an impact evaluation quantifying the trade benefits of MRAs
