

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Policy-making process in the EU



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Council of the EU

- negotiates and adopts EU laws, together with the <u>European Parliament</u>, based on proposals from the European Commission
- coordinates EU countries' policies
- develops the EU's foreign & security policy, based on <u>European Council</u> guidelines
- concludes agreements between the EU and other countries or international organisations
- adopts the annual <u>EU budget</u> jointly with the European Parliament



Presidency of the Council of the EU

Every 6 months a different EU government holds the office of Presidency for the Council of the EU. Their role is to chair and drive forward discussions in the Council – among all EU countries – on EU legislation in a honest and neutral way.

Each Presidency identifies its own set of priorities. These are determined by the pressing EU issues at the time and have the overall goal of strengthening the EU and promoting its values.

→ Holding the Presidency is an opportunity to exercise leadership!



Council decision-making

Discussions in the Council of Ministers and the adoption of decisions are the result of upstream negotiations in the preparatory bodies.

Possibility of exercising leadership with CVOs of the EU and indirectly with the Ministers of agriculture of the EU

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Organisation

- During the French Presidency, the General Directorate for Food had to chair 28 meetings (including 4 CVO meetings) and to coordinate the EU position for 6 meetings of international organizations.
- Organisation of meetings for an internal steering committee for the General Directorate for Food
- Organisation of a weekly steering committee with the Minister's adviser on diplomacy, European and international relations
- Each chairman was responsible for the preparation and follow-up of his group, and the European and Multilateral Negociation Office helped by doing a general coordination and by providing support for certain groups.

CVO meeting in June: exchanges on the follow-up and operationalisation of the Council Conclusions



Further work under the Czech Presidency

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Meetings of CVOs: other topics covered

- Sharing of experiences to improve animal welfare in farms (prevention of painful practices in breeding)
- Artificial intelligence inputs for post mortem inspection in slaughterhouses
- Mobile slaughterhouses
- Alignment between veterinary resources and animal health and protection needs: diagnostics and solutions
- Coordination of EU positions in view of meetings of international organisations (OIE/WOAH, Eu-FMD)



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European strategy for *Codex alimentarius*

Conclusions on Codex Alimentarius « The EU's commitment to an ambitious Codex Alimentarius fit for challenges of today and tomorrow » adopted by the AGRIFISH Council on 21st February 2022

4 pillars:

- Shared EU vision on the strategic role of Codex
- Ambitions for Codex and the Global Sustainability Agenda
- Strengthening Codex working methods and practices in the face of new challenges
- Reaffirming the EU's commitment to Codex through strong cooperation

Operationalisation of the Council conclusions:

- Appropriation and valuation of conclusions
- Awareness raising of third countries and Codex partners
- Mobilisation of delegates and scientific experts
