Grimmway Tour Guidelines

Grimmway will provide approved hairnets (beard nets if needed) and ear plugs. Do not take off your hairnet inside the processing facility or the tour will be terminated. A Grimmway employee must accompany visitors in the facility at all times. Please leave all personal affects in the bus during the facility tour.

- **NO cameras are permitted in the facility.** Glass of any type is not permitted in the facility.
- NO child under the age of 10 will be able to participate. This will also include babies, strollers, wheelchairs and disabilities (due to the fact the tour includes a large flight of stairs)
- Eating food, drinking beverages, chewing gum or eating carrots is prohibited in the facility.

- The wearing of jewelry, such as earrings, wristwatches, rings, pins, brooches, necklaces and bracelets is prohibited. Wedding bands are acceptable.
- NO ball caps, cowboy hats, sombreros, or straw hats will be allowed in the processing area.
- Personal belongings such as purses, newspapers, briefcases, etc. are to be left in vehicles during the tour.
- NO open-toed or open-heeled shoes, dresses or shorts are permitted in the facility (includes capris, peddlepushers, etc.).
- Shirts and blouses must have sleeves that cover the underarms and completely cover the midriff. No items shall be dangling from pant pockets or belts. Nothing shall be carried in the shirt or blouse pocket.
- Do not touch product and/or machinery otherwise the tour will be terminated.
