2023

- > To establish the national food loss baseline.
- To develop draft on the food loss reduction plan by the technical working group.

2024

- To complete the draft on food loss reduction plan.
- To submit the plan to the food loss sub committee and the national food board, respectively, for approval.

2025-2027

- To take actions and drive the food loss reduction plan along the supply chain.
- To follow up the plan for the efficiency results or the better improvement.
- To achieve the target of reducing food loss by 5% per year from the baseline.






to collaborate for delivering surplus foods to reach 900,000 meals.

Description

- The objective of this study is to examine the best practices, policies and actions of APEC member economies on reducing waste in food supply chains, in the context of promoting competitiveness for MSMEs.
- Four methods were used to collect and analyze the data.
 - 1) This study organized the APEC Workshop on Enhancing Green MSMEs' Competitiveness for a Sustainable and Inclusive Asia—Pacific: Food Sector Waste Reduction in Food Supply Chain from 13–14 January 2022.
 - 2) An online questionnaire was launched to collect food waste-related data in all APEC economies.
 - 3) This study organized in-depth interviews with representatives of MSMEs and organizations regarding best practices for reducing food waste.
 - 4) This study reviewed literature, including from government reports and academic sources, documenting food waste reduction efforts in APEC economies.
